7. <u>REPORTS</u>

7.1 Chief Bush Fire Control Officer – Mr Phil Longmire

Thanked Kyle for the Firemapper training and everyone for their work throughout the year. Coming into a low soil moisture index ahead of this summer which is not ideal. Which has reduced the ability to complete inland mitigation.

7.4 Community Emergency Services Manager

Starlink is now available to be installed on Cascade 4.4, Mt Beaumont 4.4 and 3x Light Tankers. Appliances will need to go to Perth for installation, with a stand-by appliance to be made available.

WAERN servicing is currently occurring in the Shire.

The Shire was unsuccessful for capital grant applications for Cascade and EESU. Was successful though for Mt Beaumont BFB.

Current capital works for Condingup Bush Fire Brigade shed build and external walls are up. Land amalgamation has been completed and soon to go to tender for the Grass Patch Bush Fire Brigade shed. The Coomalbidgup Bush Fire Brigade flooring is nearly complete.

7.5 Association of Volunteer Bush Fire Brigades – Mr Danny Sanderson

Zone reps have been attending ROAC's, DOAC's and other meetings.

Concerns have been raised to the content of the Fire Control Officer course. It is too onerous in regards to knowing the legislation and nothing in regards to operations.

There are many Shires still getting their LGGS applications for appliances and sheds knocked back every year. Great Southern ROAC still creating a working group to help prioritise the regions application with the regions CBFCO's. Association is trying to work with the LGGS committee in getting helpful information out.

Discussions have been had with Worksafe and LGIS in regards to farmer response units. What they need to do with workers is to take them to a fire, give them training and PPE.

8. <u>HEALTH AND SAFETY REPORT</u>

8.1 Incident & Safety Report

Automatic Vehicle Locator (AVL) – Issues with Dalyup 2.4B tracking unit, saying the vehicle is located SEA Heavy Duty Mechanics for the past 3 months. Still waiting for the service provider to rectify. Recently Grass Patch 4.4B was tracking the fire edge with vehicle still being located at the fire shed. This is of concern should have crews activated the AVL what coordinates would have been transmitted and would ComCen have received it. Still awaiting feedback from the service provider. Encourage brigades to carry out AVL checks on a monthly basis.

9. <u>GENERAL BUSINESS</u>

9.1 Farm Fire Safety Tier System

CBFCO Mr Phil Longmire ran through his farm fire response training package to assist farmers in training/developing the farm staff, especially seasonal workers as they arrive at various times. There is a checklist that farmers can use to rate their workers abilities based upon their knowledge. Farmers can also utilise the DFES Rural Fire Awareness online training for their seasonal workers.

9.2 Shire of Esperance Bush Fire Brigades Local Law 2024

Ms Zoe Sheffield-van Mierlo ran through the various amendments to the Bush Fire Local Law with the committee.

9.3 Australian Warning System

Mr Ash Peczka provided an overview to the updated Warning System. The system updated to be more aligned with the national system, which now includes action statements to accompany the warning message. Incident Controllers will need to select the most appropriate action statement to accompany the warning messaging that best reflects the incident status. It is important that we are not remaining on Emergency Warning for multiple days if it doesn't reflect the situation of the incident, the FES Commissioner would prefer that we are de-escalating our warnings and escalate back up when the incident requires the higher level of warning.

9.4 Mitigation Burning

Mr Adrian Perks asked what approvals are required to carry out hazard reduction burning in the virgin bush/scrubland on private property. It was advised that landowners will need to carry out their diligence and appropriate checks to any environmental, flora, heritage values, etc, in the area they are wanting to burn. It was suggested that landowners look into developing their own burn prescriptions, which would have a relevant checklist to cover off.

Ms Zoe Sheffield-van Mierlo advised the committee there is an approval process for those wanting to carry out hazard reduction within the Shire road verges. Landowners will need to speak to the Shire.

Mrs Claudia Magana provided an update to the 2024/25 MAF program, with Coomalbidgup Bush Fire Brigade completing hazard reduction burning on the south west side of Coomalbidgup Lakes and the western side of the Coomalbidgup town site. If anyone has an mitigation enquires speak to Claudia.

9.5 Coomalbidgup Fire Shed

Mr Kirk Jeitz raised the issue of no mains power connected to the Coomalbidgup Fire Shed. The shed was built in 2020 and the brigade was supplied a generator as its power supply on the proviso that mains power would be connected at a later date. 4 years on and this still hasn't happened and its too noisy to operate the generator and have a meeting at night time. The committee was advised that the Shire is still waiting for the energy grant funding to be opened and it won't be until May 2025 before the Shire would here anything back to its application.

Committee Decision/Motion

The Committee recommend the Shire to look into solar solutions that can provide trickle charge to maintain battery charge into the appliances before this fire season and for the Shire to apply/find a funding source for a standalone power system to supply constant power to the shed.
