7. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

1. Mr K O'Dwyer - Tanker Jetty Timbers

Mr O'Dwyer referred to an article in the Kalgoorlie Miner on 6 May 2020, which discussed transportation of Tanker Jetty Timbers that seemed to be of a high grade. Mr O'Dwyer questioned where are the photos taken of the timbers, why has the information on the transportation not been made public, why is there an investigation, who is responsible if the timber was not incorrectly distributed/transported and is there a transaction of register of all the timber distributed, if not why not.

Cr Mickel responded that an investigation has taken place, which was conducted by three Councillors. Cr Mickel explained that the report from that investigation is close to being finalised and will be brought to Council to receive.

Mr O'Dwyer questioned if the community will be informed of the dollar amount of timber left and the quantity of timber.

Cr Mickel stated that he could not answer that questioned as all the timber has been taken to stock pile at the Shire Depot.

Mr O'Dwyer questioned if the Shire has a merchant making the evaluations on the timbers, and questioned if the rest was for sale.

Cr Mickel explained that all grade four (4) timber went to Men in Sheds.

Mr O'Dwyer questioned if Men in Sheds are allowed to make a profit from selling the timber.

Cr Mickel stated that he could not comment on Men in Sheds operations.

2. Dr K Nieukerke

Dr Nieukerke referred to elevated crossing of harbour road. He stated he can appreciate that this is still just a draft concept, however it is important to understand the longer term financial implications better. Assuming that the cost of this crossing are \$1.5M to construct, a contract for the work would have to be tendered:

- 1. Are there companies, based in Esperance that would be able to perform this work
- 2. If not, what portion of the cost could be expected to be sourced from Esperance (e.g. materials, labour)
- 3. What cost benefit would this project provide to the community
- 4. What would the anticipated on-going annual cost of such an infrastructure carry in annual maintenance and depreciation/ replacement cost
- 5. What is the anticipated productivity gained from this structure
- 6. How does the increased safety for cyclist and pedestrians compare to that gained by improving the cycle/walkway portion on Pink Lake Rd between Valley Rd and Eleven Mile Beach Rd.

Cr Mickel stated that he believes companies in Esperance would have the capacity to perform the works, which would have significant cost benefits to the local economy. Cr Mickel explained there are a range of considerations that would need to be taken into account before any works would occur.

Cr Mickel stated that safety needs to be calculated in all developments. He explained that cycle/walk ways along harbour road and pink lake road do need to be upgraded. Staff are working off the 50 year cycling strategy to assist them these upgrades.

Dr Nieukerke referred to the grants Council received from the federal government to upgrade the town centre CCTV. He questioned if this upgrade would include facial recognition features, if new locations would be identified and when the upgrade is expected to be completed.

Cr Mickel explained that the Shire has not received any funding from the federal government. He stated that there is a definite need to upgrade the town centre CCTV but there is no plans for facial recognition technology.

Mr Scott added that the Shire will only be replacing the current cameras, should they receive any funding. The funding would also cover a masterplan for future development.

Cr Obourne added that the funding announcement will be in the coming days.

Mr Walker did explain that the State Government did have a funding opportunity but since COVID-19 this has been put on hold, and the Shire hasn't heard anything since.

Dr Nieukerke questioned when the deconstruction will be completed.

Cr Mickel confirmed that all decking has been removed, all that is left if piles.

Mr Scott added that the top of the remaining piles will be cut off at the end of June. After they have been removed, they will be checked for contamination.

Dr Nieukerke questioned why he has received a different answer to last month.

Mr Scott explained that it has been a month since his last question, and the status of the project has changed since then.

Cr Piercey questioned if Council can have qualifications and experience of the person assessing the timber.

Cr Mickel advised Cr Piercey Public Question Time was not the appropriate place to raise her question.

Questions from Mr Eltringham and Mr Landers were submitted prior to the meeting by electronic means. They will both be informed of the answers to their questions following the Council Meeting.

3. Mr D Eltringham

Would it have been too much to catalogue, either leaving the site or upon retrieval at the storage area? There appears to have been a 'grey area' regarding the Scope of Works at this point of the process and who was responsible for the movement of timbers to the storage area?

Mr Walker responded that there was no point in cataloguing the timber, we were not required to do this by the Heritage Council and at the end of the day the timber will be repurposed. The contract scope of works was very clear that the contractor was responsible for transport of salvaged timber to the Shire's Storage Area.

When will the contractor finish the deconstruction, perform an under-water inspection, cut off the piles, clear up debris (concrete) from the demolition of 17 December 2019 (bent 93-95), clear the site and revegetate it or has there been further variations to the tender/contract? In other words, fulfil the Scope of Works included in the tendered sum.

Mr Walker responded that there is only the pile cut off to finish the works under the deconstruction contract, this should be completed within the next month. As per the Heritage Council approved deconstruction methodology the debris on the sea floor is to be left, including bents 93-95, as debris is to be left on the seabed there is no underwater inspection required to prove the seabed is clear of debris. There has been no further variation to the tender.

How much will this reduce the length of the jetty (over water) and when was the Final Detailed Design passed and endorsed by Esperance Shire Council?

Mr Walker explained the length on the new jetty is approximately 408 metres, approximately 12 metres of this is bridging the rock revetment, which could be considered over land. This is on top of the 120 metres that has already been incorporated into the Jetty Headland. The Final Detailed Design was only reviewed by Council and was not passed or endorsed, as by this stage the Heritage Council had accepted the design and any further modification to the design would have had to go back to the Heritage Council.

4. Mr T Landers - Jetty Update

Just a question to be asked at the next council meeting. Was wondering if a report could be sent/emailed to rate payers regarding the progress of the Jetty similar to the indoor sports stadium project? I really appreciate receiving updates of the stadium.

I am really pleased the jetty works have started, but would like to know how progress is going. I also like the idea the jetty will revert back to the original name of "The New Jetty".

Mr Scott explained that an update is currently being developed by the Media and Communications team for the community which has to be approved by Maritime Construction before release. Mr Scott explained that we will now be putting out regular information.
